





VISA

Visa On Arrival (VOA) is granted to foreigners who intend to visit Indonesia for tourism, social and culture, business or government duties. Visa On Arrival is granted to foreign nationals who fulfill the requirements and conditions upon arrival in Indonesia. The Visa On Arrival is issued by the Immigration Officials at the Immigration checkpoints in Ngurah Rai Airport. We provide 20 counters at arrival terminal.

The official entry requirements for the issuance of a 30 or 7 day Visa On Arrival:

- Passport must be from one of the countries listed below.
- Passport must be valid for a minimum of 6 (six) months from the date of entry into Indonesia.
- Payment of U.S. \$ 10 or U.S. \$ 25 must be paid at the gateway, depending on the length of the required visa.
- Onward or return tickets are compulsory.
- Visitors must enter and exit through one of the 15 airports or 21 seaports Officially approved as an "international gateway" by the Indonesian Immigration department.
- The department of Justice and Human Rights has officially determined that as of August 2005.

The Indonesian Government had granted *Visa On Arrival* favor to 52 countries enabling them to purchase the visa upon their arrival into Indonesia's designed "International Gateway"at 15 airports and 21 seaports.

CUSTOMS GUIDE

- Every passenger or crew member of a means of transport arriving from abroad is required to fill out a Customs Declaration (CD), which currently can be filled out in a paperless manner, namely the Electronic Customs Declaration (ECD) via the link ecd.beacukai.go.id
- You can fill in the Electronic Customs Declaration (ECD) 2 days before your arrival date in Indonesia and it is known that the ECD is now connected to the IMEI Registration service.
- Fill in correctly and according to the steps provided until you get a QR Code. The QR code from the filling results will appear in your email or can be downloaded directly to be shown to Customs and Excise officers in the Customs Area.
- The following are the requirements for completing the Electronic Customs Declaration (ECD):
 - 1. Passport.
 - 2. Email address.
 - 3. Ticket or boarding pass.


Seminkyak has a little more class and sophistication to it and it's home to a strip of the best beach bars and restaurants in Bali.





If you've researched Bali, then I'm sure you'll know the Monkey Forest in Ubud. It's a really popular tourist attraction, and you can see why when else will you get the opportunity to get up close and personal with a band of cute monkeys?

Another iconic Bali scene is the lush green rice fields. Bali grows a lot of rice (and you will probably eat a lot of it while you are there) and it's super interesting to see how it's done! The terraces also make the perfect backdrop for some holiday shots so remember to bring your camera.





To see the best sunset you've ever seen, head to Uluwatu Temple. Get there early (late afternoon, a few hours before sunset) to explore the amazing temple that is spread out along the edge of Uluwatu Cliff before watching the sun melt into the crystal-clear ocean.

Bali is full of amazing waterfalls, but Leke Leke is one of the best, in my opinion. A little off the beaten track and less well-known, you won't have to fight with many other tourists to get some amazing photographs. Plus, it's situated only about an hour outside of Canggu, so it's pretty easily accessible. It makes for a really great day trip.



CULINARY INFORMATION



Balinese nasi campur (literally meaning mixed rice) is a fave food with locals (and us!) who typically dine on this bit-of-everything dish for breakfast, brunch, lunch and dinner. Like the pick'n'mix of the Balinese dining world, it's an assortment of Indonesia's best bites. For us, the mark of authentically good nasi campur lies in the ayam panggang (grilled chicken), the beef rendang (beef curry) and of course, the selection of hot sambals. For the best nasi campur experience, look for the buffet-style warungs that let you point to what you want from the glass cabinets.

We've all tried satay (grilled skewered meat) before – it's almost everywhere in Southeast Asia. But not everyone has had the pleasure of tasting traditional Balinese sate lilit ikan (fish satay). Skewered and spiced, minced fish is grilled over charcoal or an open fire (sometimes on the side of the road) and the result is a slightly sweet, slightly spicy and totally delicious morsel moulded around a lemongrass stalk or wooden stick. It's best enjoyed with a healthy dose of sambal – naturally.





Bebek betutu (smoked duck) is probably the most unique local dish on Bali's must-eat list. Local ducks are rubbed and stuffed with a mix of spices, wrapped in banana leaves and coconut husks, then traditionally cooked in a pit of embers underground for up to 24 hours. Spotting an authentically-cooked Bebek Betutu is easy: look for lashings of smoky duck meat that's been cooked to a melty softness, slathered inside and out with slightly charred basa gede (Bali's traditional spice mix) with lingering hints of lemongrass, turmeric and ginger.

Practically the national dish of Indonesia, nasi goreng (fried rice) and mie goreng (fried noodles) are staples in the local diet. What your nasi or mie goreng comes with depends on where you're dining, but it's generally topped with a fried egg and dried shallots, mixed with veggies and sided with pickles, prawn crackers, and a few sticks of either chicken or beef satay. Find a really good nasi goreng, and you'll be hooked for life.





It's said there are over 300 variations of sambal in Indonesia, but so far, sambal matah is our ultimate fave. It's Bali's own version of sambal, and a delicious, spicy staple for any Balinese dish. It's made by finely chopping raw shallots, lemongrass, garlic, chilli and lime, then kneading it all together with hot oil, salt, sugar and a dash of shrimp paste. It's best enjoyed on fresh fish or chicken, or if you're like us, you can just dig in with a spoon.

Not for the faint-hearted, Lawar is a Balinese meat salad made of minced pork
(or sometimes even dragonflies and turtles), offal, young jackfruit, coconut,
galangal, chilies, spices, and fresh blood. It's an out-there local dish that
makes for a real adventure on any Balinese culinary journey, but it's highly
recommended if you can stomach it! If you can't, you can request lawar without
the blood in the mix, but it's just not the real deal.





ABOUT BALI

Bali is among the world's most attractive and popular tourist destinations. The eastern coast of the island of Java is home to a tiny paradise that never fails to amaze visitors with its distinct culture, warm residents, breath-taking scenery, global activities, delicious cuisine, and limitless accommodation possibilities.

Bali has also been known as a place for global conferences due to its international standard meetings facilities. Recently, Bali has hosted the G20-2022 meetings, World Congress on Infectious Diseases (WCID), International Conference On Sustainable Healthy Cities And Sustainable Development Goals (ICSHCSDG) and many more.

The province of Bali consists of the island of Bali as the largest island with small islands around it, namely Nusa Penida Island, Nusa Ceningan Island, Nusa Lembongan Island, Serangan Island (located at the foot of Bali Island), and Menjangan Island which is located in the western part of the island. Bali.

Time zone

Bali is in the Central Indonesian Time (WITA) time zone: +08:00 hour GMT/UTC.

Season and Weather

Bali is located just a few degrees south of the equator. It has a tropical climate with sunshine all year round and tends to be hot and humid all along the year. Rainy season usually starts from November to March, and a relatively dry season often occurs from April to October; however, some showers can still occur, so it is better to always prepare umbrellas and raincoats. In the rainy season, it usually rains a couple of hours in the morning or in the afternoon, while for the rest of the day, it has sunshine for a few hours.

Temperatures are high and uniform throughout the year. They are slightly higher from October to May and the temperatures can reach 30 C, with the daily average at around 27 C (81 F). They are a bit lower from June to September, when the daily average is around 26 C (79 F). In the rainy season, there is muggy heat due to high humidity.

Transportation

In Bali there are many ways of transportation for you to travel easily from one place to another. You can rent bicycles, motorbikes, or cars. You also can take a conventional taxi (Blue Bird) or you can also find online taxi via application (Grab & Gocar) and driver who will also be your guide. Tell the driver your desired route and negotiate a fee. An important virtue to have while on the road in Bali is patience! Although the road system in the heavily populated areas is quite reasonable (condition wise), it can also be heavily congested at peak periods. Ceremonial processions often take up the entire road so if you are caught behind a procession, enjoy the colorful experience.

Currency and Bank Services

For transactions, the Balinese people use Rupiah (IDR) as the official currency. The applicable banknotes here start from IDR 1,000, IDR 2,000, IDR 5,000, IDR 10,000, IDR 20.000, IDR 50,000, and up to IDR 100,000 as the largest value. While the value of coins is IDR 100, IDR 200, IDR 500, and IDR 1,000.



ABOUT BALI

Banks are open from Monday to Friday, generally from 8:00am to 2:00pm. ATMs (cash machines) work 24 hours a day. All banks close at weekends and on public holidays. There are plenty of currency exchange offices, banks, and cash machines throughout the city.

Language

Balinese people use Indonesian and Balinese to communicate with each other. The most common foreign language used here is English.

Electric Socket, Plugs, Adapters

The socket models that you will find in Bali are models C and F. This type has two cylindrical connection legs designed which is the standard European plug. A universal plug would also suffice.

The standard voltage throughout Indonesia is normally 230 V and with a standard frequency of 50 Hz. If you are from the the UK, Europe, Australia and most of Asia or Africa, most of your phones, laptops and other gadgets could be charged like normal. However, if you come from countries like the United States, Canada, and most South American countries, the range of voltage differs in Indonesia.

Internet and Connectivity

In order to keep internet connection running smoothly, you should choose a prepaid local SIM (Subscriber Identification Module) card. With start from IDR 100.000 you can get various types of internet quota, so that you can stay online for a month. You can get a SIM card in a local merchant available almost everywhere. The WI-FI connection is usually available at hotels, restaurants, or large shopping centers

Telephone

The international dialing code from abroad to an Indonesian number is +62.

For international calls, dial 00 + national code + area code + personal number. Mobile phone network coverage is available across Indonesian and relatively good across Bali.
